What's happening in P.E?



In this Physical Education unit students worked to develop skills in dribbling, trapping and passing the ball in small and large spaces. Additional skills they utilized include throw ins, goal kicks, and penalty kicks. Throughout the unit students showed good character and sportsmanship, while strengthening their communication skills, working with a different group of peers and classmates each day. As they progressed in their skills and soccer knowledge, they closed out the unit combining all they learned in a full game of soccer.



ROCKET LAUNCHED



The rocket launch experiment by Ms. Amin's class observed a projectile in motion for Physics. The rocket launch educated the students on various chemical propellants, methods, tools, and aerodynamic shapes. Peter Gutierrez, the idealist behind

the launch, felt it was easier for students to grasp the concept of a projectile in motion with a "hands on" project. Once the rocket was built, Peter presented the rocket in class, teaching the vector and scalar quantities of the rocket's flight, aerodynamic principles, and the fun in science. Collectively the class decided to launch the rocket on J.F.K. field so that gym classes could become audience members. We launched four rockets of which two returned home and the other two were lost. Conducting cool and fun experiments like this allow the individual students to have an experience of their own, but shared also with fellow class members. It is methods like these that create, mold and educate students.

NJ MATH CONTEST

Hoboken High School Math Club members participated in our first New Jersey Math League contest of the school year. Students of all grades and levels are invited to take part in the NJ Math League contests. There are 6 contests held each year. Math Club members also participated in practice contests from previous years. All contests take place in Mrs. Tank's (Math Club Advisor) room (321) once a month. The contests are more based on problem solving skills than content knowledge. There are also awards for individuals at the end of the year.
